Co. Wicklow, known as the 'Garden of Ireland', is home to some stunning gardens from the formal grandeur of Powerscourt to the natural beauty of Mount Usher on the banks of the River Varty.

Suggested Itinerary:

to the **Avoca Handweavers**, set in the beautiful gardens of an old estate, visitors can watch weavers at work. Alternatively, make your way to **Mount Usher Gardens**, designed in the Robinsonian style with over 5000 species set in peaceful riverside surroundings.
